§ 88.212. DISBURSEMENTS. Before warrants are issued by the comptroller in payment of state experiment station accounts, vouchers covering them shall be audited and signed by the director or an assistant designated by him, in writing, for that purpose, and also by a member of the board.

§ 88.213. AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH PRODUCTS. The board of regents of The Texas A & M University System shall generate revenues through agreements establishing equitable interests, royalties, and patent rights relating to releases of agricultural research products by the Texas agricultural experiment station when economically feasible.

§ 88.215. FIRE ANT RESEARCH AND MANAGEMENT ACCOUNT ADVISORY COMMITTEE; OTHER AGENCIES. (a) The Fire Ant Research and Management Account Advisory Committee is established as an advisory committee within the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station. (b) The advisory committee consists of 12 members appointed as follows: (1) one representative of Texas A & M University appointed by the director of the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station; (2) one representative of Texas Tech University appointed by the dean of the College of Agriculture of Texas Tech University; one representative of The University of Texas (3) appointed by the vice president for research of The University of Texas System; one representative of the Department of (4) Agriculture appointed by the commissioner of agriculture;

(5) one representative of the Parks and Wildlife Department appointed by the director of the department;

(6) one representative of the Public Utility Commission of Texas appointed by the executive director of the commission;

(7) one representative of municipal governments appointed by the governor;

(8) one representative of the general public appointed by the governor;

(9) one representative of the agribusiness industry appointed by the governor;

(10) one representative of the Texas Structural Pest Control Board appointed by the executive director of the board; (11) one representative of the chemical industry appointed by the Texas Chemical Council; and
